# Thank you from the Headmaster

Thank you to everyone who has supported the Fully Funded Places Campaign since its launch in April 2016. With your help, we currently have 16 fully-funded pupils at Emanuel which will increase to 17 in September 2018. The school's summer telephone campaign returned over £110,000 of pledges to come in over the next four years. This support, alongside that of other generous benefactors, is making an enormous difference to the lives of Emanuel pupils, enabling many of them to gain an education that would not be possible without the school's fully-funded campaign. All Emanuel pupils benefit from learning in a diverse and supported community and will leave the school prepared for the challenges that lie beyond.

The Fully Funded Places Campaign not only links the school to our founder's desire for a school with 20 places for 10 boys and 10 girls, but it also recognises a need to replace the nationally-run 'assisted places' scheme;

a programme of government funding that allowed many Old Emanuels to attend the school and go on to great achievements. Our hope is that the fully-funded programme will help to replace some of this funding and mean that we continue to support social mobility through education.

We have made encouraging progress in the Fully Funded Places Campaign and we now hope to complete our aim of 20 fully funded places by 2020. I am confident we can secure funding through the ongoing support of the Emanuel community. Beyond this campaign, the school will continue to widen its access in the coming years, by sustaining its fundraising and also working more closely with the local community.

# Our ambitions

## We have three main Development aims:

### 20 free places by 2020

Thank you for your generous donations to the Fully Funded Places Campaign. We currently offer 16 free places and will extend this to 17 places in September 2018. We aim to achieve our target of providing 20 fully free places by 2020 and would be very grateful for your support to achieve this aim.

### Grow the Trust fund

Our aim is to sustain funding for the 20 free places. To achieve this, we need to grow the Trust fund, which currently stands at £3.2 million, to £9 million so that the income will fund the bursary places in perpetuity.

### Support capital projects

We aim to support the school's capital projects in part through fundraising. We are currently formulating a masterplan for estates' projects which will draw up buildings, facilities and equipment designs.

The plan will give us a clear way forward which everyone in the school community can get behind and support at the right time. We will share these projects with you as the plans are prepared.

During the summer term we hope, subject to planning, to start work on the new multi-use games area. This astro-turf facility will provide play space as well as enabling hockey training, netball, basketball and football.

Following this, we would very much like to match the success of the Dacre Building for the Arts and Humanities with another suitably-styled building focused on technology, coding, design and mathematics.

We will share further long-term plans with you as they are agreed.

# What a Bursary meant to me

## Lorelei Piper (OE2010-17) Studying Classics at Oxford University

"The bursary programme at Emanuel is just fantastic. Attending Emanuel wasn't a reality I had conceived of until the acceptance letter offering me a fully-funded place arrived when I was in year 6. I cannot imagine how different my life would have been without that opportunity. Opening up that chance to students who wouldn't otherwise have it is a key part of the school's inclusive and nurturing ethos.

I think the main influence the bursary programme has had on me personally is that it made me realise, at quite a young age, that if you work hard and earn something, amazing things can come to you. It has also opened my eyes to how lucky I and my fellow students at Emanuel are. I can't emphasise enough how proud I am to have attended the school.

Before I came to Emanuel I never even considered going to Oxford. There are so many teachers whom I regard as pivotal in my education, from making me fall in love with Latin, to teaching me how to truly read and appreciate a book, and who dedicated their weekends to rehearsals. I think the confidence I needed to apply to Oxford came from the way the teachers treated me; challenging me academically without pressurising me, professional but caring, and always encouraging."

# Campaign update


We are delighted with the progress of the Fully Funded Places Campaign.



# Giving

**All gifts, whether large or small, are very important and will be warmly welcomed. We are proud of our benefactors and are very grateful for their thoughtfulness in making a gift to help Emanuel School.**

All donors giving over £200 a year (and over £1000 in total over time) will be invited to join the Benefactors' Society by the Headmaster. All donors will also be acknowledged and thanked in our donor report or alumni magazine unless they tell us otherwise.

## Options for giving

**Regular giving:** We welcome regular gifts whenever possible as this allows us to plan for the future. Often people underestimate what even small gifts can achieve but, with the benefit of Gift Aid, it needs just 50 people to donate only £25 a month for a year to fund an entire place for that year and thus completely transform the life of a child.

**One-off gifts:** We also welcome one-off gifts for the Fully Funded Places Campaign because this enables us to build up capital in the Emanuel School General Charitable Trust. If we can build up sufficient capital, the Trust will secure these twenty free places in perpetuity.

**Sponsorship:** We are hoping that some OEs and parents will wish to sponsor a child through the school (either on their own or as part of a syndicate). If you like this idea, please contact the Development department or the Headmaster and they will be only too happy to explain how the scheme works.

**Legacy Giving:** Legacies are an ideal way of helping the school over the longer term (and in fact these have been helping us over the past 400 years) so please let us know of your plans – not least so that we can thank you for your future gift and invite you to special events.
