Capital Projects

Beyond the fee-assistance initiatives, one of our development aims is to support the school's capital projects. During the course of this academic year, we have established the on-site needs of the school, measured against our projected pupil numbers and the future curriculum developments. In the coming months we will work with a team of architects to establish a 'masterplan' for estates' projects which will draw up building designs at Emanuel. Most importantly, the plan will give us all a clear way forward, one that everyone in the school community can get behind and support at the right time. Having a cogent vision for our site

needs will be a great help as funding becomes available in order to achieve all of our plans over time. As the plans are prepared, we will aim to share them with you. Amongst other projects, we would very much like to match the success of the Dacre Centre for the Arts and Humanities, with another suitably-styled building focused on technology, coding, design and mathematics.



Alongside the masterplan, we aim to implement a steady process of site refurbishment, ensuring that we invest and care for our school. Whilst much of this will take time and be subject to support, we are making progress with some improvements ourselves. This Easter we improved the entrance to the school, making it more attractive and secure. During the summer term we will start work on the new multi-use games area, enlarging the current footprint of the old netball court next to the main building.

Refurbished classrooms and a new look for the ground floor

During the summer, our reception will be refurbished and modernised in order to make it more open and spacious for our visitors. At the same time, we will begin work on the lower floor corridor and continue our programme of classroom refurbishment in the main building which started with the history classrooms next to the new Dacre building. Our aim is that over time we will create bright, attractive and contemporary rooms that both pupils and staff will enjoy using.

An Evening With Pen Hadow - Tuesday 20 November, 2018



Save the date for 'An Evening with Pen Hadow', the second in our series of talks by influential speakers, which will take place on Tuesday 20 November. Pen is an explorer and visionary dedicated to the protection of the North Pole's unique wildlife and floating ice-reef ecosystem. He is the only person ever to have succeeded in making a solo journey from Canada to the North Pole. It took him three attempts over 15 years to achieve this single feat at the 'bleeding edge of exploration' and his remarkable personal story led to his international policy advocacy work today.

Pen made his first Arctic expedition in 1989, set up the world's first guide service to the North Pole in 1995, and co-organised the first all-women expedition to the North Pole in 1997.

Pen will talk about his experiences and the wildlife in the Arctic Ocean along with the environmental challenges the region faces. All OEs are welcome to attend this free event but please use the button below to register.



Memories of Former Staff - Ann Thorne (1987-2007)

I joined the Emanuel staff in 1987 when I returned from the Philippines with my family. I expected to stay about five years and finally left 20 years later! When I arrived, Emanuel was a boys' school and there were only 10 women on the staff. The corridors and classrooms were dark brown and cold and there were few amenities - no sports hall, central library or theatre. In fact, almost everything has changed since then to make the modern school of today. Since I live nearby, I am able to see and admire the recent changes.

I worked for four different Headmasters: Peter Thomson, Tristram Jones-Parry, Anne-Marie Sutcliffe and Mark Hanley-Browne.

I taught French and occasionally German throughout my time as a member of the wonderfully diverse and friendly Languages department and for 10 years I was also the Deputy Head of Sixth Form, working with



Richard Marriott. During that time, Emanuel became co-educational so we oversaw the development of a fully co-educational Sixth Form and started a lot of new ventures such as the Leavers' Ball, the Sixth Form Revue, careers evenings and a programme of pastoral and social activities. For example we invited interesting speakers to talk to Sixth Formers about issues outside their course of study. (It turned out we had lots of parents who had very interesting careers!)

When I left, I calculated that I had accompanied about 20 school trips/exchanges - to Angouleme, Perpignan, Paris and to also Italy as the Classics department Italian interpreter. In addition, I had helped with the preparation of around 300 UCAS personal statements.

Claudia Stanley (OE2010-17) was the Senior girls cox from 2015-2017. During that time, she successfully coxed her crew to success including a gold medal at National Schools and getting to the final of Henley Women's Regatta. She is now studying French and History of Art at Edinburgh University.

Claudia relived her Emanuel rowing days with a very early start on the river to cox our girls' 1st VIII in the lead-up to Henley Women's Regatta. Her experience and knowledge of coxing benefited the girls enormously. She provided them with useful feedback during training and top tips for racing.

At Henley, the 1st eight beat Green Lake USA (B) in their first round to progress to the

quarter-finals where they faced another strong American crew who went on to beat them.

The Junior 16 coxed four won their quarter final in a spectacular race against Henley Rowing Club where they were neck and neck for 1200m, with the Emanuel girls digging deep to push out in front in the final 30 strokes of the race. They progressed to the semi-finals but got knocked out by Kingston Rowing Club, who went on to win the final and take the trophy.

Claudia not only helped the girls in the lead up to the regatta but also came to watch the girls' race and support them from the bank. A huge thank you to her from the 1st VIII and Senior Girls' Coach, Hannah Blaikie.

Making Universes on Supercomputers



We were delighted to welcome Dr Matthew Smith (OE2002-10) back to school to deliver a thought-provoking and accessible talk on the complex subject of 'Making Universes on Supercomputers'. Dr Smith briefly detailed his research, before focussing on his current work with supercomputers which involves the integration of over 40,000 components developed into a supercomputer which is used in modelling complex scenarios such as the origins of the universe.

Matthew recently completed his PhD in Astronomy at the University of Cambridge

after earlier studying Physics and Astronomy at Durham. He was also very pleased to catch

up with a couple of his former teachers Mrs Morrison-Bartlett and Mr Paul King (photographed here with Matthew).

Since finishing his PhD earlier in the year, Matthew has continued to work at Cambridge University but later in the year he will transfer to Harvard University. After the talk, Matthew was shown Emanuel's own supercomputer, which has been designed by Mr Csaky and his pupils, and gave them useful advice on how to enhance their machine.
