Below are some of the key events happening in Life Education this term. Of course some of these may be delivered in unconventional ways, but will still be inspiring and of the highest quality.

Lower School

During the first half of the autumn term in their Life Education lessons, Year 7 pupils will have a general induction to the school's routines and processes,

learn about 'Mind your 5', our mental health initiative, and discuss issues related to friendships. The Chaplain will join us for a session on bereavement and pupils will have an opportunity to learn some First Aid skills. An underlying theme will be a reaction to the pandemic and what pupils are feeling as they return to school.



Middle School

Years 9, 10 and 11 have a broad and balanced programme which will focus both on achieving academic excellence and the challenges of the outside world. We will also welcome back 'Elevate Education' to help pupils with exam preparation and general good practice.


In addition to tutor-led Life Education we will hear from the following speakers, either in school or remotely:

- Building Academic Confidence (James Shone). Motivational Speaker James Shone will address Year 10. Mr Shone is from the charity I Can & I Am, who aim to inspire confidence and to 'inflate balloons of self-belief'.
- James Hoskison will talk on 'risks and consequences' remotely for our Year IIs. Mr Hoskison comes with the

highest recommendations and will base his talk on the dangers and consequences of unnecessary risks and how these can have dire and lifelong consequences' for young people.

Sixth Form

Upper Sixth – UCAS and Higher Education preparation including writing of personal statements, researching and making choices about courses. Planning is underway for some of the usual talks by visiting speakers covering



topics such as: Black Lives Matter; prison life; digital privacy; conservation and the Anthony Nolan Trust.

Lower Sixth – Surviving workload and adapting to A level study including live or virtual talks by staff and Upper Sixth pupils. Information about Oxbridge and revision planning will also be covered. Planning is underway for some of the usual talks by visiting speakers covering topics such as: Black Lives Matter; cancer awareness; managing stress and anxiety; drugs; HIV awareness.
