Our objectives - the difference we are trying to make

- Provide children with the opportunity to learn something new
- Inspire children to want to learn more
- Enable children to be more engaged in classroom discussions at school, particularly reluctant learners
- Enable children to gain self- confidence
- Increase the sense of community across our pupils and our partner schools
- Develop Emanuel pupils' leadership skills, empathy, kindness and respect for those from different backgrounds.

Our 2019-20 programme

Between September 2019 and March 2020 960 primary school children from 18 local primary schools participated in the programme resulting in 4,250 pupil visits. Sessions were facilitated by 124 Emanuel students supported by 19 members of Emanuel's staff.

Methodology

Targeted feedback forms were given to all accompanying primary school teachers and pupils and Emanuel pupils. All versions gather quantitative data through scaled questions and questions that allow for free comment.

The teachers' form asks the responder to measure the quality of different aspects of the modules on a scale of I (poor) to 6 (excellent). The pupils' forms use a scale of I to 4 – for the sake of our analysis scores of 3 and 4 are positive indicators. Teachers were also asked yes/no questions with space for further feedback.

Our findings are based on evaluation forms from 537 primary school pupils, 59 primary school teachers and 94 Emanuel students.




