

The drizzle was becoming a **downpour** and Henry's hair was plastered to his head. But he didn't even notice. His brain was working overtime and he just stood there **goggling**.

There it was, sandwiched between a betting shop and a run-down newsagents, and there was this leg, in one of its dustbins. Henry crossed the road to have a closer look.
