# MACMILLAN CANCER SUPPORT

#### PRIMARY AMBITIONS FABULOUS FIRST MODULE

Primary Ambitions, now well embedded in the Lower Sixth curriculum, continues to go well. Our Lower Sixth pupils have facilitated their first Primary Ambitions modules for Year 6 pupils from 12 of our partner primary schools. After a busy first half of term planning their sessions including presentations, activities, games and worksheets, it has been rewarding for our students to put their hard work into practice.

Our partner schools are incredibly enthusiastic and have loved every minute. Our Lower Sixth pupils have grown in confidence throughout the programme and delivered some really fantastic lessons across 19 different topics. Robots have been programmed, clay creatures have been formed and fired, science experiments have been mastered and gymnastics routines have been executed. We are excited to welcome our partner schools in January for the start of the second module.



#### SAVE THE DATE WINTER BOOK DRIVE

We are planning a post-Christmas book drive to collect much needed books for our partner primary schools. They will be distributed via our charity partner, The Children's Book Project. www.childrensbookproject.co.uk. The Children's Book Project's aim is to tackle book poverty and give every child, regardless of circumstances, the opportunity to own their own book. (One in three disadvantaged children own fewer than 10 books; one in ten own none.)

We will be holding our book drive on the 22, 23 and 24 January so if you are planning a post-Christmas clear out, please hold on to your new or nearly new books for our primary school partners. Look out for details in early January.



#### SECONDARY SCHOOL PARTNERSHIPS UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE SUPPORT

As part of our secondary school partnership programme, we provided university preparation support for five of our secondary partner schools including facilitating MMI, Oxbridge and Imperial College interviews for over 40 students. The MMI session alone, organised by Ben Strathearn-Burrows, Head of Science and Biology, was supported by 16 members of Emanuel staff each of whom provided detailed feedback for the participants. Participants relished the opportunity to practise their interview skills.

Our partner schools will also join us for a series of events including our Careers and Higher Education Fair in January, upcoming speaker engagements and our GCSE booster programme during the Easter holidays.

Our aim is to motivate girls to stay in school, inspire them to explore new pathways they might not have considered and to communicate a sense that all is possible!
