St Cecilia's Concert: Celebrating 430 years of Emanuel School

This year's St Cecilia's Concert was held at St John's Smith Square, one of London's great concert venues, to mark the 430th anniversary of the foundation of the school.

We welcomed over 400 guests to enjoy a celebration of the superb musical talent within our pupil body. Some of the highlights included the Symphony Orchestra's rendition of Vaughan-Williams' English Folk Song Suite, the Senior Strings playing two movements from Holst's St Paul's Suite, the Concert Band playing two movements from Tchaikovsky's Nutcracker Suite, a fully orchestrated version of the Emanuel School Song and a medley from Phantom of the Opera featuring the school choir, organ and orchestra.

Emanuel is pleased to again see some excellent outcomes in <u>*The Sunday Times*</u> <u>*Parent Power*</u> publication.

Following on from our excellent <u>GCSE</u> <u>examination results</u> in the summer, the school was ranked 6th amongst fully co-ed

independent day schools. When combined with our strong <u>A level results</u> the school was 11th among fully co-educational independent day schools.

35th anniversary of the Clapham Rail Disaster

On 12 December,1988 three trains collided at 8.10am very close to the grounds of the school after a signalling failure. 35 people were killed and almost 500 injured in what later became known as the Clapham Rail Disaster.

On the 35th anniversary of the tragedy, a large number of survivors, family members, train drivers, union members, as well as the police and ambulance services gathered at the memorial on Spencer Park to pay their respects and lay wreaths.

The organisers of the event also thanked the school for its quick response to the disaster. It was a very moving ceremony and our thoughts are with the families affected.

Scottish Rugby awards retrospective caps to Alan Friell (staff 1992-2012)

Due to the expansion of world rugby, many older games which would not have qualified for a full international cap have been reclassified. Internationally, former Head of Sport and all-round sportsman, Alan Friell, spent many

years as the understudy for the great Jim Renwick who amassed 52 caps between 1972 and 1984, whilst Alan sat on the bench or played for Scotland 'B'. One of Alan's 1974 games against the Netherlands has been reclassified and he is amongst eighteen players to be recognized with a ceremony.

Alan joined Emanuel in 1992 after spending many years teaching at Dulwich College Prep School. As Director of Rugby, he coached the 1st XV for many years and in later years returned to his roots, coaching junior pupils in the U13 and U12 teams. He put in a huge number of hours away from rugby, running almost single-handedly swimming and athletics for all of his twenty years at the school, as well as taking cricket teams in the summer. These days Al is more likely to be spotted on the golf course (or bowls lawn) than the rugby touchline and is remembered fondly by many with Emanuel connections.



Emanuel in the Community


We have an active <u>community and</u> <u>partnership programme</u> that involves pupils,

Old Emanuel First XV of the 1938/39 season

If ever there was a photo which could tell a thousand stories, this one of the Old Emanuel First XV of the 1938/39 season is it.

Fourteen of the fifteen men featured in the photo served in the war; we are unsure about the final member of the team. Four of the fifteen lost their lives, another four received military awards of high distinction, a further three were POWs at some point in the conflict and two were Battle of Britain pilots. 
The Chairman's Prize returns to Emanuel after almost 120 years

When Christopher James Bowles left Emanuel in 1905 to pursue a successful career in banking, he could not have imagined that one of the trophies he was awarded as a pupil would find its way back to Emanuel well over a century later.

We were delighted to welcome Christopher's grandson, James Bell, to Emanuel to present their family heirloom to the School Archive after more than thirty years in his possession.

At Emanuel, Christopher had a successful academic and sporting career, culminating

in being awarded the Chairman's Prize for the 'Half-Mile Handicap' (scratch race) in his final year in school. *The Portcullis* magazine notes he passed several sets of local Cambridge exams and was awarded various shorthand certificates. He was also awarded other prizes for good conduct, punctuality and in 1904 a certificate for "faithfully discharging the duties of a Monitor" in the era before we had prefects. Christopher won both Mathematics and Music prizes and returned to Emanuel in 1908 to sing in a musical event involving OEs. For the 1901 Mathematics prize he was presented with *Tales from Shakespeare,* a book still in the possession of his family.



Roger took up photography whilst studying at Emanuel and his earliest work was published in *The Portcullis* magazine whilst he was in the Sixth Form. Over this period he took many striking photographs of the school building, rowing squads in training, Combined Cadet Force camps, the trainspotting club and other day-to-day school activities. These were the seeds of a remarkable career in which Roger

photographed many personalities including some of the world's most famous photographers such as Norman Parkinson, David Bailey and Jane Bown.


