This year's Careers and Higher Education Convention will take place on **Saturday 25th January 2025 lpm-3.30pm**. Sixth Form pupils are expected to attend this event. There will be approximately 50 exhibitors from a wide range of professions who are very keen to share their experience. This includes Deloitte LLP, Transport for London, St George's Hospital, and RSPCA. We also have representatives from a broad selection of 20 universities including the University of Bath, University of Newcastle, University of Manchester, and University of Exeter.

The event is informal; guest representatives stand in front of a large board denoting their career area, and students can engage them in conversation about any aspect of their profession. We encourage students to think broadly and to visit as many stands as possible, particularly those for careers about which they currently know very little. This year we are also running a competition for students who engage most with this event with Amazon vouchers for the winners!

Booking details and further information about the talks on offer will be circulated after the Christmas holiday and will be limited by size of venue on a first come, first served basis. Although optional, I hope students will find a talk which is of interest to them.

Why Highly Selective Colleges Are Reinstating The SAT

Students may have hoped that standardized testing for college admissions would remain optional. But several highly selective schools have recently reinstated requirements, and a comparison of their announcements shows that their reasons are surprisingly similar. The university of Texas at Austin joined MIT, Dartmouth, Yale, and Brown in requiring standardized testing as part of its first-year application process. UT's rationale and its data echo that of the four lyy League+ colleges. Two reasons for the change come up repeatedly in the colleges' announcements: SAT scores predict first-year college grades, and they help admissions officers evaluate a student in context.
